

Disasters caused by blizzards often happen when fair weather changes suddenly to adverse weather conditions. You need to be extremely cautious when a meteorological observatory announces information such as " Heavy blizzard of the sort that only happens once every few years expected" or " Please

refrain from going outdoors." Because clear weather may suddenly change to blizzard conditions in just few hours, outside activities may become dangerous. When a blizzard is predicted, please refrain from going outside unless it is an essential and urgent matter.



















- ※2 If you encounter low visibility due to snow and wind when driving, please pull over and park at a nearby Road Station or convenience store until the weather improves.
- #3 If you have no choice but to stop the car on the road, please make sure to leave your hazard lights on, and put a hazard cone outside of your car to avoid rear-end collisions.
- \*4 It is important to prevent the risk of carbon monoxide poisoning. In preparation for emergencies, please make sure to always keep the following items in your car: winter clothes, blanket, gloves, rubber boots, shovel, snow brush, and a tow rope.























- ×5 Please do not shovel snow alone and keep calling out each other to make sure of your safety, especially when shoveling snow from the roof. Make sure to wear anti-skid shoes, use a ladder with anti-skid features, and attach a safety rope to your waist. Please take extra caution when climbing up or down the ladder.
- **%**6 The finer the weather is, the easier snow and ice may fall from the roof. Use extreme caution under the eaves.
- If snow gets clogged in the blower, please make sure to stop the engine first, then clear the jam out with a stick or something else.

119 people in Hokkaido were involved in snow-related accidents last winter.
